Private Client Tutor

The Private Client course on the Diploma in Legal Practice is delivered by a team of tutors who are experienced practitioners in this field. There is a vacancy for the coming academic year.

The role of Private Client tutor is an excellent way for private client practitioners to refresh their own fundamental knowledge, structuring all the knowledge you have picked up over the years to deliver it to students in a coherent manner.

It provides additional opportunity for Private Client practitioners to have regular contact with fellow practitioners. Tutoring on the diploma is an excellent way of meeting new colleagues, and sharing and exchanging ideas. Your involvement in the course also enhances your own visibility, and the standing of your firm in Private Client practice. Participation can also be used towards your CPD requirements, and will generally fulfil your non-management annual requirement.

Classes take place on Thursday afternoons from 1400 to 1600. Prior to that there is a meeting of the tutor team at 1330. The location is a modern purpose-built facility in Holyrood Road. The course runs over 14 weeks, from mid-September to late November, with the final 4 weeks in January and February.

Tutors are provided with a full set of course materials, and a detailed plan for the content of each class. There are typically about 14 students in a class.

Tutors are paid at set rates for the hours worked. Full information will be provided by University, should you wish to pursue this opportunity.

Tutors should have a minimum of 3 years PQE in Private Client practice.
